











**They are free of charge.**

















**Your RPR will:**

- come and visit you regularly and talk to you in private.












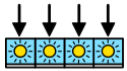

















